

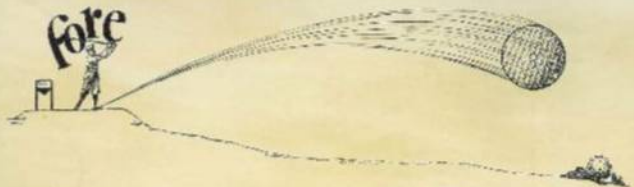

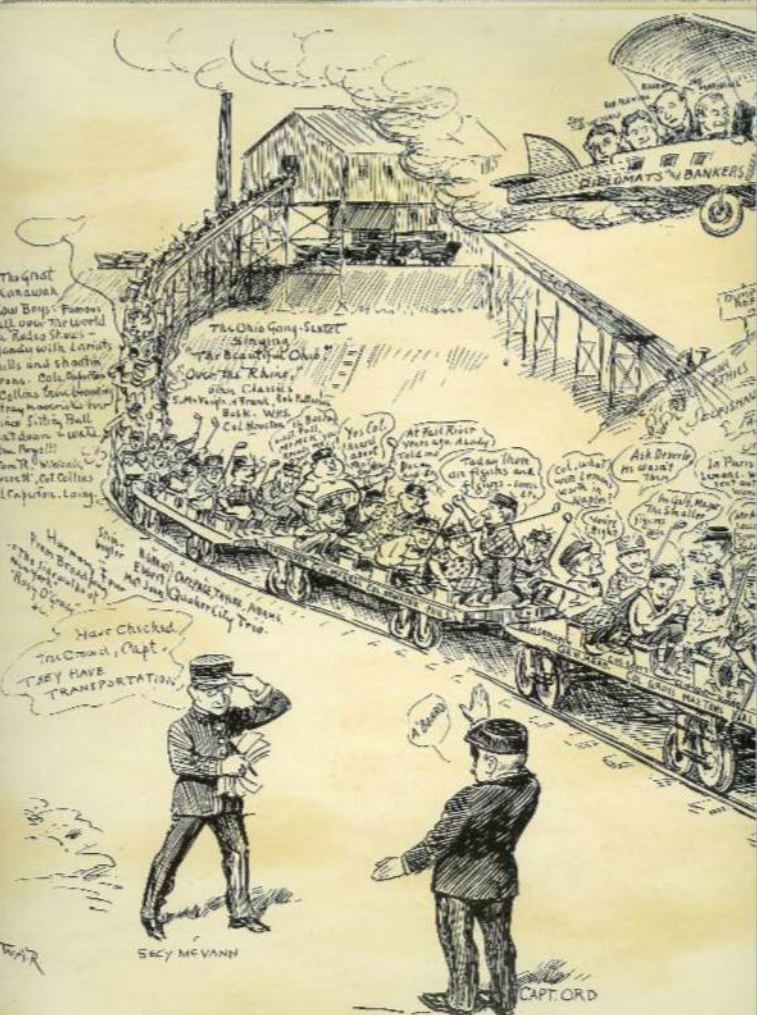
SATURDAY THE 18TH
